Ash Borer Road Block

Hundreds of millions of ash trees in North America have been killed (35 states and some provinces in Canada) since the discovery of the Emerald Ash Borer(EAB).

Just this past May, an ash tree fell over and blocked Wilderness Way. Upon removal, Chadds Ford Tree Service reported that the tree came down from "rot" due to the EAB. Some tree companies offer injections to fight the EAB and save affected ash trees while others suggest cutting the trees down and replacing with some other type of tree.



Speed Limit Radar Signs Unfortunately, the Township is not only home to wonderful art history, culture and verdant view sheds, but also home to one of the most congested intersections in the state—Routes 202 and 1. And, of course, people find their way around that intersection like the Brandywine Creek finds its way over its banks when it floods. So, the Township invested in two speed limit radar signs to rotate throughout the Township with the main goal of reminding most drivers that they're driving too fast.

In an effort to help the State Police and protect residents from the uncontrollable dangers of those who think they are in control when driving ten to twenty-five miles per hour over the speed limit, the signs also record statistics

such as how many cars are going over the speed limit and during what time of day. It's scary to say, but some people are actually driving 70 MPH down Webb and Ring Roads. Thankfully, now that we have these signs, we can position them on various Township Roads, remind drivers to slow down, and share the statistics with the State Police.

The State Police have initially responded to the Township stating that they would set-up speed traps. One thing some drivers forget besides where the brake pedal is—is that driving too fast over the speed limit could result in fines. Slow down!






**Because of environmental issues that make safe disposal expensive, there is a hazardous waste fee from the hauler for the following items:

- Older CRT Monitors and TVs: \$25 \$75/each (size varies)
- Flatscreen TVs: \$10/each
- Air Conditioners, Dehumidifiers, & Air Purifiers: \$15
- Microwaves: \$5

We are unable to accept large appliances.
